9:45 – 11:15 COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

<p><b>PE (K-4<sup>th</sup>)</b>  <u>General Description:</u> Students will learn many foundational skills that are important to various sporting activities. They will also learn how to work with their peers. Some activities may include dribbling, striking, relays, and games  <u>Requirements:</u> Students must be dressed appropriately for physical activity. Tennis shoes recommended, closed toe shoes required. Bring water-you will need it.</p>	<p><b>Cooking (5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup>)</b>  <u>General Description:</u> Learn to cook using items found locally. Basic cooking skills will be taught, as well as, safety and nutrition.   <u>What to Expect:</u> You will learn about food safety, preparation, and cooking. You will be asked to follow instructions to prepare various food dishes.</p>
<p><b>Google CS First (K-8<sup>th</sup>)</b>  <u>General Description:</u> This is a computer science club where you will create themed projects in programming language Scratch.   <u>What to Expect:</u> You'll learn how to create animated stories using dialogue, setting, and characterization using the Scratch program. You are expected to sit at a computer and work for the duration of the project. Please be aware, this club will be using Scratch to program - this is not just playing computer games of your choice.</p>	

11:30 – 1:00 COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

<p><b>PE (5th-8th)</b>  <u>General Description:</u> Students will learn many foundational skills that are important to various sporting activities. They will also learn how to work with their peers. Some activities may include badminton, hockey, and lacrosse.   <u>Requirements:</u> Students must be dressed appropriately for physical activity. Tennis shoes recommended, closed toe shoes required. Bring water-you will need it.</p>	<p><b>Music (K-4th)</b>  <u>General Description:</u> Students will learn musical principles including rhythms, tempos, melodies, timing signatures, scales, etc. Students will get to use various percussion instruments and the Boomwhacker tuned tubes. Students will practice working in unison and in concert with each other.   <u>What to Expect:</u> Ninety minutes of musical exploration. Students should come determined to learn something new, not just to make loud noises. Focused learning and cooperation are key to the success of this club.</p> 
<p><b>Robotics (3rd-5th)</b>  <u>General Description:</u> Students, once again, have the opportunity to participate in the Wonder League Robotics Club.   <u>What to Expect:</u> You will work with a team using an iPad to program Dash and Dot robots to complete various missions.   <u>Who is Eligible:</u> Anyone in 3rd through 5th grade who likes to work with a team to creatively solve problems! If you are under 12 years old and would like to participate in the Wonder League Robotics Competition, you should start here!</p> 	<p><b>Art (5th-8th)</b>  <u>General Description:</u> Learn about master artists and various elements of art.   <u>What to Expect:</u> Be prepared to come ready to draw, paint, color, and/or more. Students should have a desire to complete art.   <u>Who is Eligible:</u> Students in 5th-8th grade who like to create. This club may take some patience as there are many steps involved with making art.</p>
